Syllabus for Math 8110: Higher Linear Algebra, Autumn 2023

Sources. There is no official textbook for the course. I will compiling course notes, and other resources will be listed on the course website.

Prerequisites. Linear algebra, basic category theory, or permission from instructor.

Homework. Students must work together to solve problems in groups of 2 or 3. Ideally, students will not work with the same collaborators for the entire semester, but will try to work with everyone in the classroom at least once. However, if students develop a very good working collaboration with someone, they are encouraged to continue working with that person. Each group will write up their solutions. Groups may use whatever resources they want, but they must cite all their sources. Lack of citation will be regarded as academic misconduct/plagiarism.

Students should turn in 2/3 completed problem/week; the number should be equal to the size of the group. This is a lower bound of what students are expected to do. I will not tell students which exercises to do – exercises should be chosen from exercises given in class.

There is a strict format for homework. Groups should hand in a final copy of their homework on plain white paper without lines, perforations, or holes. Please use a new page for each problem. The final copy should represent the student's best effort, as homework counts for the entire class grade. Groups are encouraged to typeset their homework with LATEX, in which case they do not need to stick to one page per problem.

In the event that homework is not completed in the required format, the homework will be directly returned to the group, who may hand it in at the next class. Homework will be due at the beginning of lecture on Mondays. Groups may choose to email me their homework before the deadline.

A perfect score on homework will earn a score of zero points. Points will be deducted for mistakes or 'hot takes' which are not sufficiently defended. If sufficiently many points are deducted, I will ask students to redo the homework. Most likely, everyone who attends the class regularly and completes their homework will earn an A, regardless of points subtracted from homework.

Grading. Groups' grades will be entirely based on homework and attendance. In rare circumstances, and with prior consent from me, a student may write a survey article on a topic of my choice and give a lecture to the class on their article to replace some percentage of the homework grade.

Class cancellation policy. Should in-person classes be canceled, I will notify you as to which alternative methods of teaching will be offered to ensure continuity of instruction for this class. Communication will be via your official university email.
