Coursework consists of homework assignments that are assigned nearly every week, 2 midterms, and a final exam. Homeworks are to be collected at the start of class on the day that they are due, late homeworks are not accepted, but the lowest two homeworks are dropped. Students can meet with the instructor during office hours or by appointment.
